Year 4 Viking Workshop

Our Year 4 classes, Cypress, Chestnut and Jacarandas, invited the company Historic Workshops into school for a Viking themed day of events.

The children took part in various activities throughout the day, including battle formation and tactics and training on how to fight like a Viking warrior; this involved getting their own spear and round shield. The children also had the opportunity to play two of the most popular Viking board games, 9 Men's Morris and Hnefatafl.
